Minimum language requirement	TOEFL 79 (internet-based test), IELTS 6.5 or Chinese Mainland's College English Test Band 6, if English is NOT the medium of instruction at your institution.		
Can students extend their exchange stint?	Yes, but subject to approval of the home and host institutions. Application for re-admission should be raised before 1 May for Semester A enrolment and 1 October for Semester B enrolment to allow enough time to process the application and apply for extension of visa.

	Normally, exchange students are not recommended to take postgraduate courses and the approval is case by case and subjected to course offering departments under CENG. Postgraduate courses offered by other College/School will not be considered.

Insurance		
Are exchange students required to purchase insurance?	Yes. It is <b>mandatory</b> for non-local students (including exchange students) to have insurance.	
	Students must purchase insurance for themselves before they come to Hong Kong. The insurance should include, but not limited to, medical and travel insurance that will cover the entire period of their study in Hong Kong. If they are unable to do so or wish to have additional insurance coverage, they may enroll in the 'Group Personal Accident Insurance & Medical Benefits Insurance Plan for Non-local Students' contracted by CityU. Estimated Expenses in Local Currency		
Private accommodation	Private accommodation is expensive and limited in Hong Kong. It may cost around HK\$10,000 to HK\$15,000 for a two-room flat in some of the residential areas. Cost of Living	Living costs will vary depending on individual lifestyle expectations. A basic student budget is estimated to be HKD 4,500 (per month) including meals, transport, laundry, and education expenses for books and stationery.
