With over 290 societies you'll have access to a fantastic range of extracurricular activities to develop your interests, make friends and socialise.


SPORTS FACILITIES



WEATHER

Edinburgh has less annual rainfall than New York and Rome, and has a varied, temperate climate, just a degree or two cooler than London. In the winter the temperature rarely dips below freezing during the day. In the summer the days are long with around 16 hours of daylight.

TRAVEL

Edinburgh is an ideal base from which to explore Scotland, the rest of the UK and other cultural capitals of Europe. You can escape to Loch Ness, Loch Lomond or the Isle of Skye in just a few hours, or take the opportunity to visit our neighbouring European cities.

TEACHING AND LEARNING



STUDY ABROAD & EXCHANGES

STUDY ABROAD

This is a very flexible programme and your studies in Edinburgh can count towards your final degree at your home university. Even if your University does not have an exchange agreement with us you may be eligible to apply to the programme.

As a study abroad student you would pay tuition fees to the University of Edinburgh.

EXCHANGES

For our international exchange programme we have over 300 partners in 40 countries worldwide, and for our Erasmus programme we have 400 partners across Europe. You can check with your University or College exchange advisor to find out if your University is one of our exchange partners.

As an exchange student, you would continue to pay tuition fees to your university, not to the University of Edinburgh.


WHAT YOU CAN STUDY
